Benjamin Batchelder (24), son of Benjamin (2).
 Carpenter and farmer. Moved from Hampton Falls to
 Chester in 1734, and lived there the rest of his life.
 Pierce mixes him up with data belonging to Lieut. Benjamin
 Batchelder (No. 125).

He married first Rebecca Prescott, dau. of John of
 Kensington, Sep. 18, 1729. She was b. Aug. 10, 1704, and
 d. at Hampton Falls Oct. 20, 1732. His second wife was
 Elizabeth (Ambrose) Underhill, whom he m. between 1742 and
 1745.

Isaac Blasdell was appointed administrator of the
 estate of Benjamin Batchelder, of Chester, yeoman, Dec. 26,
 1781. His real estate was divided, one half to Robert
 Willson and John Underhill, and one sixth each to Daniel
 Batchelder, Eunice Batchelder, Jonathan Batchelder,
 grandchildren of the decedent. Willson and Underhill had
 purchased the shares of three other grandchildren. See
 Nos. 241 and 242 (post).

Francis Batchelder (26), son of Benjamin (2).

Usually described as a cooper, but is called inn
 holder 1736, 1738 and 1740. In his later life he was a
 farmer. He moved from Hampton Falls to Kingston in 1736.
 He lived there until 1769, or later, but by 1772 had moved
 to Deerfield. Taxed East Kingston 1772, but not 1773. He
 deeded land there to Obediah Eaton of Weare N.H., Jan. 10,
 1787, which is the last record I found of him. (Exeter
 N.H. Deeds 122-224)

Although Francis lived in Kingston, he seemed to have
 affiliated with the East Kingston church from 1744 on. He
 and wife Mary were dismissed from Hampton Falls church to
 Kingston in February, 1737, and in May, 1745, they were
 received at East Kingston by dismissal from Kingston.
 Possibly he lived in East Kingston, part of the time he is
 referred to as of Kingston.

His first wife was Mary Blake, dau. Moses & Abigail
 (Smith) of Kensington, whom he married Jan. 20, 1732, at
 Hampton Falls. She was b. Sep. 7, 1712, and was living in

1745, and probably until after birth of all the children given below.

He married second Hannah, widow of Samuel Eaton of Plaistow, N.H. She was admitted to the East Kingston church from Plaistow Oct. 7, 1759, probably not long after the marriage. She had Eaton children: Obadiah, Betty, Peter(?), and Ithamar. She died in Weare, N.H. Sep. 2, 1802, ae 90.

Francis had a favorite town office - Sealer of weights and measures, which he held at Kingston, and at Deerfield from 1774 to 1783. He was an original proprietor of Warren, N.H.

Both Eunices are marked with an asterisk in the East Kingston church records, meaning they are "since deceased." Presumably they were so marked during pastorate of Rev. Peter Coffin, 1739-1772, but no more definite assumption seems possible. Probably they d. unm.

She is not marked with an asterisk. Perhaps she was the one who m. Richard Clough at East Kingston (church records) May 14, 1766.

Theophilus Batchelder (27), son of Benjamin (2).

Cooper. Lived at Hampton Falls. He married Maria Blake June 2, 1757, dau. Moses & Abigail (Smith). She m. 2. Nathan Webster of Brentwood, N.H.; and died Mar. 5, 1764 (Bible of No. 272). He d. between Mar. 8 and Mar. 20, 1754.

Will of Theophilus of Hampton Falls, Mar. 8, 1754 - May 29, 1754. Wife Meriah. Three sons, Theophilus,

In 1926 Leon E. Batchelder of Richmond, Me. wrote me: "My father Samuel E. told me that his Grand ma Ruth told him that Timothy had a brother that took a load of produce from where they lived and took a neighbor's boy and went to Portland Me. and sold it and pocketed the money went the boy home went to N.H. and later learned he fell in with some well to do old people that were childless and made his home there."

Hallowell Me. records have marriage about 1805 of Gilman Greeley, b. Feb. 2, 1784 in Gilmanton N.H., son of Samuel & Mary () to Hannah, daughter of Benjamin & Theodate Bachelder. They (Gilman and wife) had lived in Deerfield, New Hampshire before going to Hallowell, and moved in 1812 to a place near the Piscataqua. I have no other data on Benjamin with wife Theodate, and note these items here, without considering them to prove identity with the Benjamin bp. in 1754.

Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolutionary War, Vol I., has a Benjamin Bachelder (also Batchelder) as serving from June 12 to Dec. 1, 1781, in Capt. John Reed's Company of Col. Samuel M^c Cobb's Reg't. at Falmouth Dec. 8, 1781. This was a Lincoln County regiment.

John Batchelder (31), son of Stephen (3). Weaver and farmer. Lived at Hampton until 1739, when

he moved to Little Boar's Head, in North Hampton, where he afterwards resided. Little Boar's Head was not so described then, but is the present name of the eastern part of the town on the Ocean. Selectman 1759. His commission from Gov. Wentworth, Mar. 26, 1771 as "Ensign of the Fourth Company of the Third Regiment of Foot in the County of Rockingham" is in the writer's possession.

He married Elizabeth Moulton Mar. 18, 1724/5, dau. of Josiah & Elizabeth (Worthington), b. Sep. 10, 1699, living 1769. He d. Apr. 18, 1770, ae 70.8 (No. Hampton church).

A revoked will of John's, preserved in the family papers, dated Jul. 16, 1766:- Wife Elizabeth, Son Nathaniel one shilling. Son John the south half of my lot in Nottingham where he now lives, except etc. he paying his sister Mary Marston four shillings. Son James all other estate. Son Peter Batchelder one lot in Chichester. Son Increase Batchelder one lot in Chichester. Son Josiah Batchelder lot in Chichester and marsh in Little River marshes. Daughter Mary Marston £1.5. Daughter Elizabeth £1.10 and a cow.

Deeds at Exeter, 128-97: - Peter Batchelder of Falmouth, Cumberland County, Mass. James (does not sign) Batchelder and Josiah Batchelder both of North Hampton, Increase Batchelder of Deerfield, John Batchelder and Mary Marston, widow, both of Farley (Fairlee) Vt., to David Lawrence of Epping - release all title to one half a saw mill that stood on land which our brother Nathl Batchelder of Nottingham lived on in 1763, which Nathaniel and aforesaid John Batchelder bought of our father John Batchelder of North Hampton Mar. 31, 1757, being in the 20th lot in the 5th range in Nottingham. This deed given because the 1757 deed is missing - to confirm the title. Dated May 24, 1790. Betty Tuck also signs this deed, although not named.

Col. Jere Batchelder was a leading citizen of Kensington. Was a Lieut. in the Revolution (N.H. State Papers XV, 331,339) His wife Sarah d. Dec. 24, 1823. He died Feb 1, 1818. His will dated Nov. 19, 1808, mentions wife Sarah, nephew Stephen Kimball, sisters Theodate Sanborn, Mary Blake, Huldah Kimball. Also names Jere Batchelder Hobbs, Jere Page (son of Robert), Molly Philbrick, Sally Hobbs, Abigail Batchelder that lived in my family.

Dow's Hampton p. 729, states he was bp.
Oct. 11, 1719, son of John, but the Moses b. Oct.
28, 1733, son of Ebenezer is more probable, and if
he settled at Northwood is our man. Mary's
husband settled in Northwood and built the first
house in N. in the spring of 1762. He was one of
the organizers of the Baptist Church of East
Northwood, at his house, Jul. 27, 1779. He was
dismissed in 1793. Family moved to Vershire, Vt.
See Cogswell's Hist. Nottingham, and records of E.
Northwood Bapt. church (in N.H. Hist. Soc.

Tailor and farmer. Lived at North Hampton. Deacon of the North Hill church 1760-82. Married Sarah Drake, dau. of Abraham of Hampton, Nov. 23, 1738. He deeded all his property to his son Nathaniel of North Hampton, Feb. 9, 1789. No probate record of his estate. He died Mar. 22, 1797 (Half Century Discourse, by Rev. Jona. French, p. 41). His wife was born Apr. 8, 1720, and was buried Jul. 6, 1805, ae 85.

Dow's Hampton, p. 594, gives nothing further. The History of Nottingham, p. 627, states Josiah died Apr. 7, 1803. There is no trace of him on Northwood records. Hollis B. Edgerly wrote this section of the Batchelder family for the History, and in 1881 he wrote my father he got the information prior to settlement of Northwood from Joseph Dow (the Hampton historian. Apr. 7, 1803, is the date of burial of another Josiah Batchelder of North Hampton, as given in the church records there (No. 316). My conclusion is that Dow first assumed the date referred to Josiah (423) and so wrote Edgerly, but later discovered the error and corrected it in his History. In 1907, at my request, Mr. Edgerly asked his aged mother regarding Josiah, and wrote: -

"Mother says cannot tell you sure anything about Josiah brother of Increase (first settler) but thinks he died in Hampton, and thinks he choked to death." This I give for what it is worth. No record at North Hampton found, and he does not appear in New Hampshire Deeds or Probate. Nor in Association Test 1776 (N.H. State Papers XXX)

The son whom Pierce wishes on Josiah was in fact son of Nathaniel (425).

Probably Josiah died early and unmarried.

Carter Batchelder (43) son of Samuel (4).

Called cordwainer in 1765 and 1767. The day after the battle of Lexington he marched in Capt. Henry Elkins company as far as Ipswich, but I find no further Revolutionary record. Later in life he was a sea captain, and died at sea Jul. 16, 1806, ae 79.8.

His first wife was Huldah Moulton, dau. of William of Hampton, married Jan. 22, 1756. She was b. June 13, 1732, and d. Apr. 7, 1773, ae 40.10. He married second Hannah Lane Sep. 27, 1778, dau. Thomas & Elizabeth (Bryant). She was bp. Aug. 1, 1742, and d. Apr. 21, 1810, ae 67.9.

He lived at North Hampton in 1756, but moved to Hampton at or soon after marriage, and resided there the rest of his life. He never lived at New Hampton or Sanbornton. No probate record of his estate.

Known as "Tailor Nat." To be distinguished from Nathaniel (61) and Nathaniel (311). He is identified in deeds as "tailor," and was called Nathaniel Jr. in 1758 and 1759. He moved to Hampton, probably near the time of his marriage.

He married Ruth Sanborn, dau. Jeremiah & Lydia (Dearborn), Dec. 14, 1758. (Hampton records, and South Parish, Portsmouth, Church records). She was b. May 7, 1744, and d. May 6, 1816, ae 72.2. He d. Jan. 29, 1806, ae 75.

Will of Nathaniel of Hampton, "taylor," Mar. 22, 1802 - Feb. 25, 1806. Names wife Ruth, sons Sanborn and Levi. Four daughters, Betty Leavitt, Lydia Johnson, Ruth Dearborn and Mary Garland. Three grandchildren, Eunice, Jonathan and Polly Batchelder. Son Jeremiah, Daus. Anna and Abigail Batchelder.

The 1790 Census, under Lyndborough, has "Batchelder, Carlton, 1,-,1. This item is correctly printed from the mss. record at Washington, but this mss. record is evidently a "fair copy," and not a house to house or family by family record. In other words it has been copied from a previous draft or compilation. I know of no available Carlton Batchelder and therefore query if this item should not be a Cotton Batchelder. If so, he was apparently married in 1790, and might have left children, of whom no record or mention is known. Cotton is named in the distribution of his mother's estate in 1796 (after his death), which is some confirmation of his leaving a widow or children, although technically by surviving his mother, his estate would be entitled to this share, even if he died unmarried.

Lieut. Benjamin Batchelder (125), son of John

There is a positive tradition among his
descendants that he was born the year Kensington was
set off from Hampton Falls which was 1737. However,
as his birth date on record is Oct. 20, 1735, and
Hampton Falls church records give his baptism on Oct.
26, 1735, tradition has to be rejected in this
instance, in spite of its positiveness.

The suit against his brother Nathan's estate
(ante) suggests he lived with the latter most of the
time from 1756 to 1763, but elsewhere frequently in
summer.

John Mason Batchelder of Holliston Mass. wrote me
in February, 1901: - A letter from Ezekiel Lane of
Candia (Nov. 1864 - "Your great grandfather Lieut.
Benjamin I knew well he was a brother to my

grandfather Lane. He was one of the first settlers of this town and with his wife joined in forming the Cong. Church in Candia in 1770."

J.M.B.'s letter (above) also states: - "My grandfather Oldin often described his grandfather Lieut Benj as a tall dark looking man." ... "1760 Lieut Benj. was in Montreal as a soldier in the French & Indian War on arrival of the news of the death of George II & accession of George III. On his return brought the seed of the Wickopee tree (or withe bearing tree); held commission as Ensign and Lieut under King George." "Lieut. Benjamin during the Quebec expedition under Benedict Arnold was ordered to take a detachment of men to an exposed situation and conceal themselves by lying flat on the ground. An officer reported Lieut. Benj. as standing erect alone and exposed to the fire of the enemy. On arrest for disobedience of orders he found to his great surprise he had been standing as a target for the enemy." [This I give in detail as the exact authority I have for Benjamin's Revolutionary service]

As to the French and Indian War service, Potter's Military History of New Hampshire p. 146, gives a Benj. Batchelder as sergeant in Capt. Jonathan Tilton's company from Sep. 19 to Dec. 14, 1755. Also a Benjamin from Oct. 1, to Oct. 20, 1756 (p. 178) The first item is apparently Lieut. Benjamin. The second is uncertain, as well as other items. Some others clearly refer to Benjamin (242).

Marston Mss. (now at N.H. Hist Soc. ?) shows Benjamin Batchelder in Capt. Jere. Marston's company at various dates: - Receipts May 20, 1760, and May 26, 1760 (at Litchfield); Nov. 2, 1760 at "No. 4" (now Charlestown N.H.): (those ante apparently as a private (?)(no rank given) order dated Crown Point Nov. 16, 1760, to pay "Lieut Batchelder." Order May 26, 1761, to pay "Left. Benjamin Batchelder."

Lieut. Benjamin lived in Kensington until 1762, but is of Candia in 1763, and until 1812, when he removed to Andover, N.H. He was one of the first board of Selectmen of Candia in 1764. Was admitted with his wife to the Chester Church June 19, 1768, and his children Sally and John were baptized there Jul. 14, 1768. He is to be distinguished from Benjamin (24) who lived in Chester proper, (from which Candia was set off) In deeds, on account of his military rank, Lieut. Benjamin is called "gentleman," but was undoubtedly a farmer by occupation; also owned a saw mill.

Benjamin married Dorothy Prescott (in Deerfield in 1762 by family tradition: no record found). She was daughter of Benjamin Prescott of Kensington and Deerfield, born about 1741, and died in Wilmot, N.H., Dec. 22 (or 23), 1837. Lieut. Benjamin died in

Esquire Abraham Batchelder (141), son of Jethro (14)

Lived first at Kensington. His grandfather, Dea. Nathaniel, deeded him land in Chester in October, 1743, and between that date and March, 1749, he is described in deeds sometimes as of Kensington and sometimes as of Chester. Probably he maintained affiliations in both towns. In January, 1749, and up to September, 1755, he is called of Contoocook (now Boscawen). He was of Canterbury, which then included Loudon, in January, 1759, (27 N.H. State Papers 144). It is commonly stated he and his brother Jethro
