Davis Batchelder (411), son of Henry (41).

Farmer. Lived in North Hampton in early life, but sold out there in June, 1768 and the next month bought land at East Northwood. He moved to Northwood about 1770, as his son Simon deposed in 1837 that he had lived in Northwood since he was twelve years old. The Nottingham town meeting of March 27, 1770, elected Davis a highway surveyor, which is the earliest item I have found showing him in Northwood.

Davis was taxed in Northwood to 1793, but not in 1794. He was not financially prosperous in his later years. He was one of the organizing members of the Baptist church July 27, 1779. He deeded a lot of land to it in 1781.

A sermon delivered by Rev. Elliott C. Cogswell at the funeral of Deacon Simon Batchelder (4112) on March 12, 1847, states:

"Deacon Simon Batchelder ... was the son of Davis Batchelder of Northampton who came to this town about 1770, having married for his first wife, Miss Mary Taylor of Old Hampton, by whom he had four children, viz: Henry, Simon (the subject of this notice) Mary and an infant son. Mr. Davis Batchelder's second wife was Ruth Palmer, of Northampton (sic), and his third wife a widow Marston, of the same town. By these last two wives he had fourteen children, four of whom survive."

Davis married first Mary Taylor of Hampton, daughter of John & Sarah (Dearborn), who was born Apr. 15, 1737. She was alive Aug. 18, 1762. Her father's will, dated Jul. 7, 1778, and proved Mar. 29, 1796, names his two grandsons, Henry Batchelder and Simon Batchelder, sons of his daughter Mary Batchelder, deceased.

Davis' second wife, as above stated, was Ruth Palmer. Ruth was the mother the children born 1765 - 74.

As a third wife, he married Abigail Marston of Northwood, Oct. 29, 1780, (Northwood). "The Widdow of Davis Batchelder" died May 7, 1821, ae 73 (Northwood

Baptist Church). She was mother of most, if not all, of the children whose births are not recorded.

Davis himself died Oct. 5, 1816, ae 84. (Baptist church) There is no probate record of his estate. To identify all of his eighteen children is difficult. The first ten are recorded on Northwood records, or baptized at North Hampton, - or both - except that Benjamin's baptism is on Epsom church records. A diary kept by Simon (4112) - in possession of Albert B. Moore ( ) gives the deaths of Davis ("my father") Oct. 5, 1816; of Mary Hill wife of Benjamin Hill ("my sister") Jul. 28, 1833; and of Joseph Batchelder ("my brother") Sep. 29, 1841, ae 66.

Increase, Daniel and John were identified as children of Davis by his third wife, by Charles M. Batchelder ( ) (in 1901) and Albert W. Batchelder ( ) (in 1908). In 1931 I inquired of Albert W. if Joshua Batchelder could have been an uncle of his father. He replied that: - "The name Joshua does certainly strike an answering chord." The name of Stephen was not familiar.

Mrs. Harriet Sanborn (4114.iii.iv) of Corinth Vt. wrote me in 1908: "Davis Batchelder (i.e. 4114) had one sister, her name was Dolly Batchelder, she married Walter Warren, if you would like to know more about them write to Mrs. Walter Adams, Chelsea Vt. she knows where their daughter lives." On this I place less reliance, but see the list of children erroneously assigned to Davis (4114) on pages 194-195 of Pierce's Batchelder Genealogy, which may possibly contain data intended for the family of Davis (411), and in which is a Dorothy m. \_\_\_\_\_ Dame and res. Lakeport N.H.

Pierce confuses him with No. 3412. Northwood records, Selectmens' accounts, give the following items: - A settlement made Feb. 20, 1792, with the constable for 1790, credits the latter with "Paid Simon Batchelder toward keeping Benj. Batchelder 16s.11d." - also "Paid for expense to Doct"

Jackson for Benjamin Batchelder 8 shillings."  
Other items: - in 1792 "Paid Henry Batchelder time and expense with Benj. Batchelder to Andover to the Doctor £3-15-3." And in 1793 "Paid Simon and Davis Batchelder for keeping Benj. Batchelder £1-16-7." The Baptist Church records state Benjamin died of consumption Apr. 27, 1793, ae 25. There is no evidence he was married.

Placing him in the family of Davis is an inference from his appearing as a young man in East Northwood, and the lack of any other Northwood family in which to place him. m.

No evidence Sally was dau. of Davis, unless residence in Northwood and lack of any other family in which to place her, is such. Doubtful.

Samuel Batchelder (413), son of Henry (41).

Farmer. Always lived at North Hampton. Called Samuel Junr. to distinguish him from No. 42.

New Hampshire State Papers Vols XIV and XV, have items of Revolutionary service by one or more Samuel Batchelders, apparently from Hampton or North Hampton. The possible Samuels are No. 413, No. 426 and No. 432. See also No. 1121. I hesitate to draw inferences, but the Samuel and Samuel Jr. in Capt. Henry Elkins' company in November, 1775, ought to be this Samuel (413) and Samuel (426). Samuel (432) is too young, and Samuel (42) too old, to be probable.

Samuel married Elizabeth Taylor of Hampton June 14, 1764, daughter of John & Sarah (Dearborn). She was b. Nov. 23, 1744, and was buried Nov. 8, 1813, ae 69. Samuel died Jan. 7, 1822.

Will of Samuel of North Hampton, Mar. 29, 1811, - Feb. 14, 1822, names - wife Elizabeth, dau Elizabeth Sanborn, dau. Sarah Godfree, heirs of son John, deceased, viz. Sally, John, Mark, Abigail, Josiah, Mary, Elizabeth

John Batchelder (421), son of Samuel (42).

Farmer. The Exeter News-Letter of Sep. 29, 1840, states that Northwood was settled March 25, 1763, by Moses Godfrey ( ) and Inceas and John Batchelder, who removed from North Hampton and set down in the lower part of town where the Baptist Meeting House stands ... John Batchelder died June 6, 1812, aged about 70. Cogswell's History of Nottingham, p. 515, gives a more detailed account of this first settlement of Northwood.

John was then unmarried. He married Sarah Murray, according to his grandson James M. P. Batchelder ( ). She died Nov. 7, 1809 ae 60.

John was selectman of Nottingham in 1769, and of Northwood after its separation therefrom, in 1774 and 1783-5. He died June 6, 1812, ae 71.

John (421) above. Was a Deacon of the Baptist Church. He  
married Anna Taylor of North Hampton Feb. 25, 1770 (North  
Hampton Church), dau. John & Abigail (Drake): bp. Apr.  
26, 1747; d. Sep. 15, 1827, ae 81 (or in 81<sup>st</sup> year).  
Increas died Jul. 7, 1827, ae. about 83 (or 84, or in  
85<sup>th</sup> year).

Farmer. Always lived at North Hampton. Dow's History  
of Hampton, followed by Pierce in his Genealogy  
erroneously confused him with Nathaniel (614). The latter  
Nathaniel is easily identified as the settler in Barre,  
Vt. Nathaniel (425) remained on the homestead in North  
Hampton, and his father Samuel Batchelder, (of North  
Hampton, taylor) deed to his "son" Nathaniel Batchelder  
(of North Hampton, yeoman), all his real and personal  
estate, except household furniture given "my wife" Sarah,  
Feb. 9, 1789. (Exeter Deeds 144-181).

Nathaniel married Elizabeth Taylor of North Hampton  
Jan. 10, 1782 (North Hampton Church), dau. of John; b. May  
29, 1761: d. Oct. 26, 1842. They owned the covenant in  
that church Dec. 7, 1783, after confession. Nathaniel  
died Mar. 12, 1803, ae 47. His will, dated Mar. 11, 1803,  
names wife Elizabeth; sons Josiah, John (land in  
Northwood), Samuel (land in Sanbornton), Nathaniel (land  
in Sanbornton); daughters Sarah and Betsey; son Jonathan.  
His widow left a will which mentions only dau. Elizabeth  
Batchelder and son Nathaniel.

Samuel Batchelder (426), son of Samuel (42)

Farmer and mill owner. Followed his brothers to Northwood as early as 1782, perhaps as early as his marriage. His father deeded him land in Northwood on Jan. 3, 1781, and the Selectmen of Northwood released a rangeway to him in March 1776. The History of Nottingham states he married Nancy Low of Stratham. Stratham records give the birth of Anna Low, dau of Jacob & Sarah, Feb. 2, 1760. (76-18) The New Hampshire Gazette of Dec. 11, 1780, states: - "Three daughters of Jacob Low of Stratham, N. H., were married there Dec. 10, 1780."

I think Samuel served in the Revolution. See sub No. 413 ante. He has been accepted as a D.A.R. ancestor on service that I (doubt is/cannot identify as) his rather than another Samuel's. (D.A.R. Lineage Books 15-106). See No. 1121.

Will of Samuel of Northwood, June 10, 1815, - Feb. 13, 1823, names wife Anna; eldest son Elias Smith Batchelder; sons Jesse, Mark, Ira and Samuel; four daughters, Sally Knowles, Polly Nealey, Lydia Tasker and Nancy Morrill.

Samuel died Jan. 20, 1823, ae 65.5. His widow might possibly be the "Mrs Batchelder" who d. Jul. 1826. (Northwood Cong. Ch.)

William Batchelder (433), son of Carter (43).

Farmer. He served in the Revolution in 1780, (N.H. State Papers XVI, 155, - See also do. p. 147). He was living in Hampton in 1784 and 1785; in Exeter in 1788 and 1789, but moved to Sanbornton in 1789 or 1790. From there he moved to Meredith in 1804, but returned to Sanbornton in 1816, and died there June 1, 1846 ae 82.

He married first Mary Burley of Stratham, dau. of David & Anna (Smith?). She was b. in Newmarket Apr. 5, 1767, and d. Mar. 17, 1830, ae 63. His second wife was Martha ( ) widow of John Wadleigh, whom he married Sep. 17, 1833 (Gilmanton). She died Oct. 7, 1866 ae 96 (93) (buried in Meredith Bridge Cemetery, Laconia).

Martha applied in 1857 for a pension on William's service under Capt. Benj. Whittier in Col. Moses Nichols' regiment from Jul. 6 to Oct. 6, 1780. The application was rejected on the ground that she had already received bounty land and a pension as widow of John Wadleigh. In her application Martha gives her marriage as Sep. 10, 1832, and the date of William's death as June 1, 1844.

Will of William of Sanbornton, Apr. 21, 1846 - June 16, 1846, mentions wife Martha W. and children, Comfort wife of John Buntin, Josiah, Abraham, Burleigh, Samuel, Nathan and Nancy wife of Nathaniel Norris.

The account below is based largely on Runnell's Sanbornton.

Pierce confuses him with Nathaniel (614). The will  
of his father, Nathaniel (44), is conclusive of his  
identity, as well as other proof.

Nathaniel Jr., was a farmer and lived at Hampton,  
where he died Feb. 22, 1802. He married Eunice Colby June  
6, 1790, with his sisters Lydia and Ruth, the Hampton  
Church records having the three marriages marked  
"together." Was she the Eunice Colby ante (No. 61.i.iv)?  
I know of no evidence either way, except her name and her  
son's.

Nathaniel's widow m.2. Abraham Towle of North  
Hampton, who d. 1823. Widow Eunice Towle is taxed  
there to 1842, but not 1843.

Jeremiah Batchelder (445), son of Nathaniel (44).  
 Carpenter and travelling singing master. Moved from  
 Hampton to Newburyport, Mass., where he is on the tax  
 lists from 1808 to 1816, inclusive, but not later.  
 Probably went to Salem, Mass., then; as he was there in  
 1821 or earlier. He lived there a number of years, but  
 appears in the Charlestown, Mass., directories of 1838 and

Jethro Batchelder (512), son of Jonathan (51).

There are three Jethro Batchelders to be distinguished - Nos. 512, 1414, and 1421. The last two are well defined, leaving No. 512 as the Jethro who appears in Gilmanton in 1770, moving to Barnstead. The appearance of others of the family of Jonathan (51), or of individuals of names identical with his children, there much strengthens the identification. I therefore feel sure Jonathan of Gilmanton and Barnstead is son of Jonathan (51), whose family is not found in Newmarket, from soon after his death, so far as any record can be found.

Pierce confuses this Jethro with No. 1414.

We find Jethro Batchelder "of Gilmanton" bought a lot of land in Barnstead, adjoining the Gilmanton town line, June 26, 1770. He probably moved there at once. His application for pension, in July, 1832, states he enlisted from Barnstead, where he then resided, in February, 1776, under Gen. Stark, and served one month at Cambridge, Mass. That in April, 1776, he enlisted for eight months under Capt. Amos Morrill, marched to Norwich, Conn., thence to New York City for three weeks, then to Albany for three weeks, thence to Canada, where he served out his full time and then returned home in the fall. That in July, 1777, he enlisted under Capt. Nathaniel Wilson and was stationed

at No. 4, now Charlestown, N.H., serving two months. The pension was granted.

In April, 1797, Jethro sold out in Barnstead and moved to Danville, Vt., where he remained until his death. He was a joiner, and undoubtedly also a farmer.

The pension papers in Washington state Jethro was married to Dorothy Mighel in 1774 by Rev. Mr. Parsons of Gilmanton. John Batchelder of Danville was appointed administrator of the estate of Dorothy Batchelder of Danville Jul. 12, 1843, and he applied for pension due her from death of Jethro (Nov. 25, 1841) to death of Dorothy (May 21, 1843 in her 91<sup>st</sup> year). A sheet torn from the family Bible was filed which gave the names and births of their children (as below).

Danville town records give Dorothy's death as May 22, 1843, aged 90. The widow's pension 1841-3, was given to her surviving children, - Sally Sinclair, Joseph Batchelder, Moses Batchelder, and Betsey Haviland.

George W. Batchelder (51.225) furnished me information as to marriages of children of Jethro (512).

Jonathan Batchelder (513), son of Jonathan (51).

Jonathan was probably born as early as 1740, as he deeded land in Nottingham, of his father's, June 30, 1761, and he must have been of age Mar. 29, 1762, when the Newmarket town meeting elected "Jonatha Bachler" as "Hay ward & hogg reafe." On June 9, 1763, Rev. William Parsons of South Hampton, N.H., deeded to Jonathan Batchelder of Newmarket, yeoman, lot No. 5 in the 1<sup>st</sup> Range in the Lower Division, in Gilmanton, N.H. Lancaster's History of Gilmanton states Jonathan became a citizen there in 1769. The Association Test, August, 1776, lists two Batchelders in Gilmanton, - Isaac (No. 1412), and Jonathan. The latter refused to sign on the ground that the use of arms to defend the country was against his religious principles.

In June, 1787, Jonathan bought land - 20 acres - in lot No. 6 in the same range as above, and in March, 1791,

still more in No. 6.. This last purchase adjoined the Barnstead line.

The 1790 census lists Jonathan with a family of 1-3-1, which suggests he then had a wife, and three sons under sixteen years of age.

On January 24, 1800, he conveyed the homestead where he then lived to Emerson Porter. This may possibly have been a mortgage. On March 11, 1800, Samuel Shepard was appointed his guardian, he being non-compos.

The 1810 census of Gilmanton has the following Batchelder families:

Elisha Batchelder was (is) No. 5223. Enoch had married in 1808 Elizabeth, widow of Nathaniel (11,121), and probably her family is listed to him. Samuel, who is evidently a son of Jonathan, (see below) apparently had his parents with him at this time, they being the adults over forty five years old. If Jonathan had three sons, as the 1790 census indicates, Samuel Enoch and Josiah are candidates, but only Samuel is proved. (But see Josiah (1717).)

In the records of the Congregational Church of Gilmanton is a Bill of Mortality kept by Rev. Isaac Smith (apparently the whole town, and not his church alone). This has under January, 1817, the death of "Old Mr. Bacheldor 70." The age seems understated (see above). On March 18, 1817, Samuel Shepard was appointed administrator of his estate. The inventory showed a homestead of fifty acres, of which seventeen acres and all the dwelling house were set off as dower to the widow, Molly Batchelder.

The first mention of Jonathan's wife is her appearance on the above deed of January 24, 1800, where she signs as Mary. She evidently survived her husband, and is perhaps the Mrs. Batchelder who was burned to death at the poor house Nov. 23, 1827. (Hist. Gilmanton, 298).

In July, 1828, Samuel Batchelder of Gilmanton sold his rights in land in lots 5 and 6 in the 1<sup>st</sup> Range etc, adjoining "land formerly set off to widow Molly Batchelder as her dower in the estate of Jonathan Batchelder," and "reserving a convenient piece of ground - where it is

used for the purpose of burying the family of the said Samuel Batchelder." This indicates Samuel was selling property of Jonathan, of which I found no deed to him. Between poor indexes at the time of my search, and lack of examining court records, the original probate papers, and some other possible ground. I do not feel that possible information as to Jonathan has been exhausted.

So far as the above goes, it is evident that Samuel was a son of Jonathan, and Enoch and Josiah may have been. See 1412.iii

No further record found. The 1810 census (above) indicates he was then married and had three sons and one daughter under ten, and one son over ten. Note that Enoch named his son Josiah.

David Batchelder (521), son of John (52).

Shoemaker and farmer. Probably is the David who in 1760 served in the French war under Capt. Jeremiah Marston in Col. John Goffe's regiment at Crown Point; is so claimed by his descendants. He was David Jr. of Hampton Falls in 1765, but had moved to Raymond before June, 1771, and enlisted from there in the Revolution.

For this service he was later pensioned. His pension application states he enlisted Dec. 15, 1775 at Winter Hill, Mass. under Capt. James Norris in Col. Enoch Poor's regiment, served as corporal and sergeant, and was discharged at Fort Independence, near Ticonderoga, N.Y., Dec. 15, 1776. Descendants claim he served at Bunker Hill, and the N.H. Rev. Rolls give further service: - He enlisted as a corporal under Capt. Norris May 26, 1775, and again under Capt. Rowell in Col. Nathan Hale's regiment for duration of the war, mustered May 20, 1777. He was reported as taken prisoner at "H. Town," which indicates he was captured at Hubbardton Vt. Jul. 7, 1777 along with Col. Hale and others of his command.

This and another return give David's personal description as five feet eight (or ten), dark complexion and black (or dark) hair.

From Raymond David moved to Saco, Maine, probably by 1780, when his son Benjamin was there. He was there (Pepperrellborough) by the 1790 census, and remained there the rest of his life, apparently except that when he applied for a pension in January, 1821, he is called of Portland, which may have been an error of his attorney or agent.

David married first Sarah Prescott Aug. 11, 1763, (Kensington Church). She was living Jan. 3, 1793. His second wife was Mary \_\_\_\_\_ who died at Saco Sep. 22,

1817. David died at Saco Jan. 8, 1829, and his estate as administered consisted solely of his pension from Dec. 4, 1828, to Jan. 8, 1829. The balance of the estate was paid to Jonathan Batchelder.

David is said to be buried in a private graveyard in Old Orchard, Me., formerly a part of Saco.

Children, recorded at Raymond, but probably born at Hampton Falls:

John Batchelder (522), son of John (52)

Farmer. Moved from Hampton Falls to Raymond soon after 1768, when he was taxed in Hampton Falls. His first wife was Elizabeth Clark. The Hampton Falls records give the date of marriage as Nov. 14, 1768, but as that is immediately followed by the births of their two children in 1766 and 1768, it is obvious that the year is wrong. His second wife was Abigail \_\_\_\_\_. Her grandson Daniel Batchelder (52242) in October, 1910, could not recollect her family name. Elizabeth must have died soon after the birth of her son Levi, as John and the later children are by Abigail. Abigail died Oct. 15, 1823, and John died May 26, 1829, ae 85 (N.H. Patriot of Aug. 10, 1829).

Fullonton's History of Raymond states John was a short, thick-set man, about five feet five inches tall. That he had six sons and six daughters.

Jonathan Batchelder (525), son of John (52).  
 Farmer. Moved from Hampton Falls to Raymond early in  
 life, probably with his father. Served in the Revolution  
 from Raymond. He did not apply for a pension until Apr.  
 12, 1837, and then stated he enlisted in 1777 under Capt.  
 Stephen Dearborn and served until after the battle of  
 Bennington, and then volunteered under Gen. Stark to go to  
 Bemis Heights, serving three weeks longer (after his time  
 had expired). Josiah Batchelder (524) testified to  
 serving with Jonathan at Winter Hill in 1775. The  
 application was rejected on the ground that he had not  
 proved six months service, which seems true, but the N.H.  
 Rev. Rolls in State Papers, Vol XXX show additional  
 service in 1776.

The account of Jonathan's family is substantially  
 from Fullonton's History of Raymond, which names his  
 children. He married Hannah Kimball of Raymond Dec. 18,  
 1777. (Hawke (now Danville) Church). She died Apr. 22,  
 1834, ae 79 (Hist. Raymond), or ae 73. (Morning Star of  
 May 1, 1834). He died Apr. 11, 1839 ae 84. No probate  
 record.

Reuben Batchelder (611), son of Nathaniel (61)

Usually called a joiner, but once (1771) a cabinet maker, and in 1825 a husbandman. He married at Nottingham West (now Hudson), N.H., Mary Carlton Nov. 6, 1766. (Hudson), or Oct. 24, 1765, according to a copy of Hudson church records at N.H. Hist. Society. She was daughter of Osgood Carlton (N.E.H & G. Register, 1901, p.52).

Reuben lived at Hudson for several years after his marriage, but between 1771 and 1776 moved to Lyndeborough, possibly when his father removed thither. In or about 1788 he moved again to Warren N.H., where he remained the rest of his life. He was taxed there from 1788 to 1815.

He served in the Revolution, being one of the men raised for service in Canada under Capt. William Barron, in July, 1776. Donovan & Woodward's Hist. of Lyndeborough, mentions his serving, and in William Little's Hist. of Warren (1870 Ed.) p. 288, is this further entry: - "Other revolutionary soldiers who lived in Warren are ----- Reuben Batchelder. Mr. Batchelder never got a pension. He would tell in his old age how he suffered in the war, and then cry about it. He was a prisoner, and came so near starving that he had to eat the very leather breeches which he wore."

While Reuben is not on Warren tax lists after 1815, when his poll became exempt at age of seventy, he continued to live there and owned land which he deeded to his son Nathaniel in 1825.

The N.H. Patriot of Jan. 3, 1825, reports the death: - "In Warren, Mary, wife of Mr. Reuben Batchelder, aged 79; they had lived together 59 years." Reuben himself died in 1826 (Hist. Warren). There is no probate record of his estate. His children's births are recorded as given below, and are probably complete, although there is no check on the possibility of an omitted birth, unless it be the lack of stray Batchelders in Warren. Such are Comfort Batchelder who married Silas Lund Oct. 23, 1788, and Jeremiah Batchelder taxed 1793 only, but I doubt if either of them belong in Reuben's family.

Lieut. Joseph Batchelder (613), son of Nathaniel (61).

Went from Hampton to Sandown with his father. He married, probably at Sandown Sarah Ferrin, who was born in Sandown June 7, 1751, daughter of Alpheus & Abigail ( ) Ferrin. Alpheus Ferrin died Jul. 27, 1756, leaving three children - Sarah, William and Alpheus.

As early as 1777 Joseph moved to Lyndeborough, perhaps when his father died. He served in the Revolution from July 1 to July 12, 1777, in a company which marched

from Lyndeborough to Ticonderoga of which his brother-in-law Samuel Houston was Lieutenant. Joseph's title of Lieutenant (1789) was apparently from rank in the militia subsequent to the war. He was selectman of Lyndeborough in 1789, and in May, 1790, was living in Lyndeborough Gore, (later set off as Greenfield).

Joseph's next migration was to Plainfield Vt., where he was one of the first settlers. He commenced a clearing in the southwest corner of the town in 1792, but did not move his family thither until 1794. He "made a pitch" of 650 acres, which in substance means "squatting" on a selected tract of land before acquiring any legal title thereto. This, of course, would usually be on land owned by the state, or if granted as yet not subdivided to individual owners. Usually the title could be later obtained without much difficulty, as land was plentiful, and settlers desired by the owners.

Joseph sold his farm in Lyndeborough Feb. 24, 1794 and probably soon after moved his family to Plainfield. His was one of the first four families to settle there. See Hemenway's Vermont Gazetteer, Vol. 4, and Child's Gazetteer of Washington County, Vt. These give an account of the defective titles which the settlers in Plainfield acquired, and how proceedings in 1808 compelled them to pay a second time for their land, although their betterments were saved to them. Deed from Hezekiah Davis to Lieut. Joseph, Jan. 22, 1795, is with the Barre, (Vt.) Hist. Society. Miss Hemenway also gives an account of Joseph's family.

Lieut. Joseph died Mar. 25, 1827, and his widow Sarah died Aug. 23, 1830. They are buried on the "Cheney Batchelder Farm" in Plainfield, with a bronze marker "Soldier of Revolutionary War New Hampshire Militia" at Joseph's grave.

A letter from Mark Glidden (son of 613.vii) to William W. Batchelder (613,211 ) in February, 1897, states his grandfather, Joseph Batchelder, married Sally Ferrin, and had children: - Joseph, Nathaniel, Isaac, Alpheus, Abigail, William, Sally, Josiah and Mary. "Josiah was never married, the other eight had 63 children of which 7 of us are supposed to be living."

The 1860 census of Plainfield gives his age  
as 64, born in New Hampshire. He was probably two

Nathaniel Batchelder (614), son of Nathaniel (61).

Dow's History of Hampton and Pierce's Batchelder -  
Batcheller Genealogy confuse this Nathaniel (614) with  
Nathaniel (425), although Pierce (p. 161), under Lieut.  
Joseph (613), has the substance of the following correct  
statement. Miss Abby M. Hemenway's Vermont Historical  
Gazetteer Vol. 4 (History of Washington County) p. 716,  
states: - "The Batchelder brothers, Joseph, Moulton and  
Nathaniel, came from Lyndeborough, N.H. Nathaniel lived  
and died in Barre and was the grandfather of the late J.  
Wesley Batchelder of Plainfield."

The records amply confirm Miss Hemenway, and identify  
Nathaniel of Barre Vt. as the brother of Lieut. Joseph  
(613) and Jonathan Moulton (615). We find the following  
facts recorded.

Capt. Nathaniel (61) died in Lyndeborough Oct. 11,  
1784. After that date "Nathaniel Batchelder" signs  
various petitions etc, regarding the setting off of a new  
town from the westerly part of Lyndeborough. These are in  
N.H. State Papers Vols. 12 and 13, and the dates are Dec.  
7, 1784, May 26, 1790, and Jan. 7, 1791. Greenfield was  
incorporated in June, 1791, and included a portion from  
the westerly part of Lyndeborough. Joseph, Reuben and  
Moulton Batchelder appear on these same documents.

The Hillsborough County Deeds at Nashua N.H., show  
Frances Epes conveyed to Nathaniel Batchelder of  
Lyndeborough, yeoman, on Jan. 1, 1790, forty nine acres in  
Lyndeborough, being the northerly end of the lot on which  
Nathaniel then lived. On Oct. 13, 1792, (after the  
incorporation of Greenfield), Nathaniel Batchelder of  
Greenfield, yeoman, sells 150 acres in Greenfield, and his  
wife Phebe Batchelder signs the deed.

The Washington District Probate records, at Montpelier, Vt., show that administration on the estate of Nathaniel Batchelder of Barre was granted to Nathaniel Batchelder Jr. Mar. 30, 1815. Dower was assigned to the widow Phebe Batchelder, and minor sons Ira and Cotton W. Batchelder were cited to choose guardians, which Ira did Mar. 4, 1816, but Cotton W. apparently did not, (on account of his nearness to full age, probably). Administration on the estate of Phebe Batchelder of Barre was granted to Nathaniel Batchelder Apr. 15, 1816.

The 1790 Census of Lyndeborough gives "Batchelder Nathan" with a family of 1-2-4. This is undoubtedly Nathaniel (614). See sub No. 616 ante.

Nathaniel served in the Revolution, in February, 1777, under Capt. Amos Emerson in Col. Joseph Cilley's regiment (N.H. State Papers XIV, 600). Donovan & Woodward's History of Lyndeborough, not knowing that Capt. Nathaniel (61) had a son of the same name, erroneously assigns the war record to the father. J. Wesley Batchelder of Barton, Vt., wrote me in May, 1909: - "I used to hear my Father and my Uncle Wesley say their grand Father my great grand Father was a soldier in the Revolution War. Why I remember it so well my oldest brother ... took a great deal of interest ... and was continually asking my Father and Uncle if they could tell just how many Battles their grand Father was in etc." The History of Lyndeborough, p. 161, states Dea. Ephraim Putnam and his son Ephraim hired Nathl Bachelor to serve. That is much more likely to be a young man than the father, Capt. Nathaniel.

Nathaniel's wife, Phebe, is not identified. Her name first appears on the 1792 deed above, and the marriage was probably after the removal to Lyndeborough. Augustus C. Batchelder (614,431) wrote me in 1909: - "I am not very well posted about the Genealogy of my grandfather's family, but always supposed my grandfather's mother was a Colby." The naming of their second son as Colby, confirms - or suggests - that Phebe was a Colby, but on the other hand Nathaniel's sister had married a Colby. Proof lacking. Phebe was living in November, 1815, but died before the following April 15<sup>th</sup>.

The children of Nathaniel (614) I have obtained from statements of his descendants, - Mrs. James G. Rutter, J. Wesley Batchelder and Augustus C. Batchelder.

Nathaniel probably moved to Barre shortly after selling out his Greenfield property.
