Nathan Batchelder (1322), son of Elisha (132).

Farmer. Lived at Danville, N.H. Married first Sally Williams of Danville, Mar. 5, 1794 (Kingston Church). She was dau. of Joseph of Danville (d. 1809), and she died Nov. 25, 1799, ae 27. He married second his cousin Lydia Batchelder (135.vii) June 30, 1802 (Hampton Falls); born Nov. 18, 1773; died Aug. 30, 1806 in 33<sup>d</sup> year. His third wife Abigail French of (East?) Kingston, married Dec. 30, 1807 (Kingston Church). She died at Dea. (Robert?) Smith's in East Kingston Dec. 22, 1840, aged 71 lacking 9 days. She was dau. of Abraham & Sarah ( ) French of East Kingston, and her will, dated Dec. 15, 1831, mentions her sisters and children, including Ruth wife of Elisha Batchelder (13,221), as child of her sister Ruth Prescott.

Elisha Batchelder Jr. (1323), son of Elisha (132).

Farmer. Settled in Andover, N.H., at or about time of his marriage. Sold his place there to his cousin David (1342) in July, 1809, and moved to Bolton, Canada. Either he returned to Andover, or he died a resident of Bolton, and his family immediately returned to Andover, I do not know which. He married Sarah Rowe Aug. 24, 1797 (Andover), dau. of Lieut. John & Susannah (Scribner). She was born Feb. 6, 1775, in Andover, and died at Wilmot Flat, N.H., May 8, 1871. He died June 2, 1815.

Mark Batchelder (1341), son of Reuben (134).

Farmer. Moved from Danville to Andover, N.H., between 1785 and 1788, and lived in the latter town thereafter. He served in the Revolution in Capt. James Gray's company of Scammel's regiment in 1777, at Ticonderoga, Skeensborough and Stillwater, and enlisted again in 1781 under Capt. Parsons, marching from Hampton Falls to Fort Ann (N.Y.) by way of Springfield, Mass., and Charlestown, N.H., then back to Charlestown, where he was discharged. He was pensioned in 1833 for this service.

Mark married Abigail Rayno of Andover Nov. 28, 1788 (Register, Apr. 1904). She was born 1758, and died Apr. , 1833. Mark died Aug. , 1845.

Farmer. Res. Andover where he d. unm. Jul. 12, 1891, ae 77.10.19.

David Batchelder (1342), son of Reuben (134).

Farmer, but usually described in deeds as "gentleman," - a description frequently due to official rank in the militia. Lived first in Danville, but in July, 1809, he bought the place of his cousin Elisha (1323), in Andover, including the cattle, tools and even the family beds. He sold his Danville property the following February (1809), and moved to Andover. He died there May 8, 1839.

David married his cousin Dolly Batchelder (132.v), Feb. 23, 1787 (Danville). She was born Nov. 17, 1762, and died Mar. 19, 1852, in \_\_\_\_\_, Ill.

"Not known when or where he died: supposed to have been murdered" (William Adams Batchelder record). "Was a drover, supposed to have been murdered in the West." (Eastman's Hist. Andover).

Phineas Batchelder (1343), son of Reuben (134).

An unsolved problem. He served in the Revolution for the town of Hampton Falls, from Sep. 17 to Nov. 24, 1781, under Capt. Joseph Parsons, which is not long enough to entitle him to a pension under the act requiring six months service, and he does not appear on the Pension Bureau records. He deeded land in Danville to his stepfather, Joseph Clifford Sanborn, Mar. 24, 1785, then being "of Hawke" (Danville).

I infer he was the Phineas who married Polly Clough at Lebanon, N.H., Mar. 14, 1793, and that he is also the Phineas living in Plainfield, N.H. in 1794 and 1801, and living in Piermont N.H. 1812-15. The 1800 census of Plainfield shows him head of a family of one male and one female 26-44, and two females under 10.

The William Adams Batchelder record states Phineas went to Stanstead Canada and is reported to have left several children. He is not named in "Forests & Clearings - History of Stanstead County, Quebec," by B. F. Hubbard, and a casual glance at early deeds at Standstead did not disclose his name.

Elisha Batchelder (1351), son of David (135).

Farmer. As a young man he went from Hampton Falls to Pittsfield and settled on land belonging to his father, which belonged to Josiah (13) as an original proprietor of Chichester, from which Pittsfield had been set off. Elisha's father deeded this land to him in Sept. 1803.

Elisha married Sarah Lane of Hampton Falls (no record of the date found), dau. of Samuel & Hepsibah (Sleeper). She was born in Hampton Falls Mar. 24, 1769 (Pittsfield) and died in Pittsfield Feb. 27, 1819. Elisha died there Oct. 11, 1813, and his widow was appointed administratrix Nov. 23, 1813. The children - Nathaniel, Samuel and Nancy gave her a receipt, or release, June 18, 1819.

Elisha's family is correctly given in "Ancestry and Descendants of Deacon David Batchelder," but Pierce splits Nancy into a dual personality, and arbitrarily adds Jonathan (32,213) to the family. If more proof is needed

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it is found in a deed from Nathaniel (13511) to Samuel (13512) Feb. 12, 1823, by which Nathaniel quit claims one third of 130 acres in Pittsfield, the homestead farm "where we now live," in common with said Samuel and Nancy Batchelder. (Rockingham Deeds 236-242).

Josiah Batchelder (1352), son of David (135).

Known as "Capt Siah" Batchelder. Farmer. On Jan. 2, 1794, he and his father David (135) bought of Ezekiel French a farm in Loudon, Josiah receiving a deed of the westerly half. Josiah moved from Hampton Falls to Loudon later in 1794, or early in 1795. He died there Oct. , 1815.

Josiah married Dolly Sargent of Loudon Feb. 17, 1803 (Loudon), dau of Capt. John of Loudon. She died Nov. 26, 1846, ae 75 (gr. stone)

Farmer and substantial citizen of Hampton Falls, where he always resided. One of the founders of the "Line Church," of which he was chosen a deacon June 10, 1844. Was he the Reuben Batchelder who served in the War of 1812, in Capt. Jona. Nason's Co. of Lt. Col. Thos. Lovering's Regt., Sep. 12 - 29, 1814. (Potter's Mil. Hist. of N.H. 208)?

Reuben married Betsey Tilton of Hampton Falls Feb. 5, 1807 (Hampton Falls), dau. Michael & Lucy (Burnham), born Nov. 9, 1782, died Nov. 29, 1857 ae 75. Reuben died Mar. 7, 1868, ae. 90.10

Moses Batchelder (1354), son of David (135).

Farmer. Lived on the homestead at Hampton Falls of his father and grandfather. Representative from Hampton Falls 1835. Married Abigail Drake of Hampton Jan. 5, 1809 (Hampton and H. Falls), dau. Samuel & Mary (Jeness). She was born in Hampton Sep. 24, 1784, and died Jan. 17, 1872, ae. 87.3. Moses died Jul. 11, 1861, ae. 80. from an accident at his mill.

Abraham Batchelder (1411), son of Abraham (141).

Farmer. Lived on his father's homestead in the easterly part of Loudon. His father deeded him land in Canterbury Feb. 8, 1773, perhaps the homestead in question.

He was known as Abraham Junr. up to 1805, on the Loudon tax lists, and in deeds, but not in 1806 or after.

The first town meeting of Loudon was held at his house Mar. 23, 1773.

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On Nov. 17, 1815, he deeded to Jonathan Batchelder (14117) his home farm "according to deed which my father" Abraham Batchelder gave me.

Abraham's marriage and births of nine children are recorded at Loudon. He and his wife are buried in the old cemetery at Loudon Centre. His wife was Anna Judkins whom he married May 7, 1772. She was born Feb. 17, 1750, and died Jul. 25, 1836, ae 86.5.8 (gr. st.). He died Aug. 24, 1836, ae. 92.6.20 (gr. st.), which age varies one month from the Mar. 4, 1744, date of birth in the record on Loudon town record.

Abraham's will, dated Jan. 14, 1832, proved Sept. 1836, names wife Anna; children - James, Hannah Haines, Sally Osgood, Judith Sanborn, Nathan, Abraham, Josiah, Philip, John and Jonathan, and granddaughter Susan Haines.

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Isaac Batchelder (1412), son of Abraham (141).

Farmer. Lived in Loudon until 1772, when he moved to Gilmanton. Remained there until 1806, or later, but in February, 1808, was of Sandwich, N.H.

Isaac, of Sandwich, formerly of Gilmanton, deposed

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Feb. 10, 1808, that about 44 years ago, when he was 16 or 17 years old, he was with his father Abraham Batchelder and two others, who were a committee to lay out the Gov. Shute farm in Northfield.

Isaac married first Mary Gilmore Jan. 31, 1770, (Methuen, Mass.). Methuen records give the marriage of Thomas Gilmore and Joanna Gutterson Feb. 10, 1736, and the baptism June 10, 1744, of Mary dau. Tho. Gilmore. Isaac's wife Mary died June 9, 1805, in Gilmanton. He married Second Wid. Martha French Nov. 5, 1806, (Sandwich). Isaac died Jul. 26, 1817.

A family record gives one list of the births, and another list of the deaths, of Isaac's children, but is silent as to marriages, and I am left uncertain regarding Joanna and Polly, as the entries of their deaths do not necessarily mean they were single, although the "Batchelder," rather than any married surname, is some evidence.

Jacob Batchelder (1413), son of Abraham (141).

Farmer. Lived in Loudon until 1771, or later, but moved to Pittsfield, N.H., prior to February, 1773. He remained there the rest of his life. A descendant stated he settled on Catamount Mountain, near Berry Pond, in Pittsfield.

Jacob's first wife is unknown. No record of the marriage is reported from any town to the State Dept. of Vital Statistics, and I can find no deed by Jacob in which she might be expected to join to release dower.

His second marriage was to Mehitabel Cleaveland of Gilmanton Oct. 8, 1789, (Gilmanton town and church). He married third Mary (or Polly) Cleaveland of Pittsfield Dec. 26, 1799 (Gilmanton). According to the "Genealogy of the Cleveland and Cleaveland Families," these two wives were sisters, children of Eleazer & Anna (Bradford)





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partial family record (wife and one child). The Hist. of Sanbornton states Abel was "son of first Jethro who was a noted surveyor and met death by freezing at Stewartstown N.H. while engaged in that service."

It is difficult to imagine a more inaccurate statement, but Pierce accepted it and placed Abel as a son of Jethro (142). See Pierce p. 176.

Pierce has this Jethro badly confused with Jethro (1421) and Jethro (512).

While Jethro (1414) lived in Loudon there were two older Jethros there. His uncle Jethro (142) as the oldest was Jethro Senr. (or more commonly without any addition after his name). The next oldest was Jethro (1421) who was therefore called Jethro Junr. Jethro (1414), as the youngest, was Jethro 3<sup>d</sup>.

Jethro (1414) was a farmer. He lived in Loudon up to 1789 (taxed there 1783-9), although that residence may have been interrupted for a short period, as the marriage record calls him of Chichester. I find no other evidence of residence there. He moved to Strafford Vt. in time to be listed in the 1790 census. In a deposition in support of the pension application, in Oct, 1843, of Sarah Blake (widow of Elijah), Jethro Batchelder of Strafford, aged 79, states he moved to Strafford in 1785. Probably 1785 was the date of his first going to Strafford, but his complete transfer of residence, or leaving Loudon, was not until 1789. Hamilton Child's Gazetteer of Orange County Vt. (1888) - Business Directory, under Strafford lists: - Root, Don C. farmer, "farm settled by Jethro Batchelder."

Deerfield records have the marriage by Rev. Timothy Upham of "Jethro Batchelder to Debroah Levitt Both of Chichaster Decem<sup>r</sup> 8, 1783." The marriage is also recorded at Strafford, but with date as Oct. 12, 1783.

Pierce asserts Jethro served in the Revolution but refers to data clearly belonging to Jethro (512). The latter was pensioned and was living with his son John in Danville Vt. in 1840. Jethro (1414) also had a son John, but neither of them lived in Danville.

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The New Hampshire State Papers, XV, 512 and XVII.25, give two Revolutionary service items which are not claimed by Jethro (512) in his application. They might belong to either of the three Jethros - 512, 1414 or 1421.

Jethro died in 1849, aged 88 3/4, according to Vt. Hist. Gazetteer, II, 1084. He had eight children as below, as his granddaughter, Mrs. Marcella Adams (14142.ix) wrote me in 1908. Pierce, while omitting entirely the daughter Nancy, evidently had a fairly full set of dates for the rest of the family. According to his account, Jethro was b. Jul. 7, 1761, and d. Apr. 10, 1849; his wife Deborah b. Jul. 12, 1760, and d. Oct. 16, 1843; and the children born as follows - Joseph Oct. 20, 1793, John Apr. 13, 1784, Elizabeth Apr. 29, 1785, Mary Jan. 18, 1787, Sally Dec. 21, 1791, Abigail Sep. 3, 1789, and Lucinda Oct. 13, 1798.

Jethro's father, Abraham (141) deeded his place in Loudon to "Jethro Batchelder of Loudon, yeoman," Oct. 11, 1782 (no "3<sup>d</sup>" used), but Jethro 3<sup>d</sup> of Loudon, yeoman, (and Deborah) deeded it to Jacob (1413) Aug. 18, 1789. This is probably coincident with Jethro's removal from Loudon to Strafford, and is clearly connected with Jacob's guaranty to pay the father's debts, bearing the same date, which Jethro had recorded at Strafford, and which Pierce quotes in full (p. 174), and which conclusively establishes that Pierce has given Jethro (1414) the wrong parents.

Thomas Batchelder (1415), son of Abraham (141).

Farmer. Called Thomas Jr. from 1794 to 1804 to distinguish him from Thomas (114). Called "Ensn" in 1799, rank in the militia.

He lived in Loudon until his marriage in 1787, but in or about that year settled in Cabot Vt. He lived there about six years and then returned to Loudon, where he was

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taxed 1794-1822. He is in the 1790 census both under Cabot and Loudon, which may mean the home ties were not definitely severed. He was elected auditor in Cabot in 1789, and constable and collector in 1793.

In September, 1821, Thomas sold his Loudon property and in June, 1822, then "of Loudon," bought land in Windsor, Me., to which place he promptly moved, and lived at least until 1841, and perhaps until his death. The doubt on this is due to the fact that his gravestone in a cemetery on Mill Road, in Windsor, states he died in Loudon, May 6, 1845, aged 78.

Thomas married Ruth Clark Aug. 23, 1787 (Methuen, Mass.), probably the daughter of Joseph & Ruth (Clark) Clark, born in Methuen Dec. 10, 1759. She is buried in the same cemetery, the date being furnished me as Aug. 25, 1827, aged 77.8, which I suspect contains an error, (1837 or aged 67.8?)

Children, first one recorded at Cabot, and the others at Loudon, (no other check on the list being complete):

Probably died young, as later child named Judith, and father's family at 1810 census contained no female aged 10-15.

Was of Salem, Mass., when he married Sarah Tink of Salem, Oct. 21, 1819 (Loudon town and church). Taxed at Loudon 1820-1. Of Boston, Mass. 1831-56, perhaps later, usually called cooper, but inspector at Custom House 1839-40, and machinist 1851-3 (Boston directories). Was later of Chelsea, Mass., where he died Jul. 24, 1882, ae. 85.3.1. His wife was dau. of Thomas & Sarah (West) Tink, and died in Boston June 11, 1854, ae. 61.9.8. If he had any children, I have found no record of them, but do not know where he lived 1821-31.

Jethro Batchelder (1421), son of Jethro (142).

Farmer and tavern keeper. Always lived in Loudon. Pierce has confused him with Jethro (1414), whom see ante on that point and on possible Revolutionary service. On this last I might quote from Loudon town records (account with the constable for 1777) - "Paid Jethro Batchelder Junr for part of a Solder went to Beninton."

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Jethro was known as Jethro Junr. up to 1803, when his father died. He is taxed in Canterbury (of which Loudon was a part until 1773), 1767-71, and is on Loudon tax lists 1774-89 and 1792-1816, but not later. In the 1790 census of Loudon he appears as Bachelder Jethroe Junr 3-1-3. The selectmen of Loudon approved of him annually to keep a tavern in various years from 1800 to 1823.

His death is reported in the N.H. Patriot, Jan. 10, 1825: - "In Loudon, Jan. 6, 1825, Mr. Jethro Batchelder, aged 80 years. He was one of the first settlers of said town, and sustained a good moral character. He left numerous descendants who are scattered in different parts of the country. Printers generally are requested to notice the foregoing."

The Patriot of Mar. 22, 1830, gives his widow's death: - "In Loudon, Feb. 27<sup>th</sup>, Mrs. Lydia, relict of the late Jethro Batchelder, aged 87. Printers in Maine, New York and Penn. are requested to notice the above."

Jethro and Lydia are buried in the old cemetery at Loudon Centre and their stones give the same dates and ages as above notices. In 1921 I examined the Bible of David (14212) then in possession of Edward E. (14,212,232) and in it was the family record of Jethro, giving his date of birth, - Nov. 12, 1745, his marriage to "Lydia Walket" (Walcott) Jan. , 1767, and the deaths of both as above. Lydia was born Sep. 15, 1744.

Jethro left a will, Apr. 12, 1809 - Jan. 18, 1825, which names wife Lydia; daughters Polly Lovering, Dorcas Rogers, Sukey F. Chase; son Aaron Bachelder; grandson Jacob Bachelder farm where his father lived, he paying his brother Rodney and sisters Sally Bachelder and Charlotte Bachelder; Sally widow of son Jacob and mother of grandson Jacob Bachelder; son David Bachelder.

Daniel Bachelder (1422), son of Jethro (142).

Farmer. Lived in Loudon until 1787, which is the last year in which he is taxed there, and probably then moved to Danville Vt., although the deed to Nathaniel (1423) of his Loudon property, Dec. 23, 1789, calls him of Loudon. In Danville, 1790 census, 1-3-5. From Danville

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he moved in 1800 to Stanstead, Quebec. He conveyed one half of a lot in Unity, N.H., to Abraham Sanborn of Unity, Dec. 31, 1774, (Cheshire Deeds, 4-518), but if he ever lived there, it must have been for a short time.

"Forests & Clearings. History of Stanstead County, Quebec," by B. F. Hubbard and John Lawrence, has an account of Daniel and his family. It states his first wife Judith Jedkins was born in Hopkinton N.H., and died 1796; that his second wife Zeruiah Morrill died 1853; and Daniel himself died Feb. 17, 1832. It names his twelve children as below, except "Silas" for Sias.

Daniel married first Judith Judkins Sep. 22, 1774 (South Hampton town and church). She must have died in 1798, rather than 1796. He married second Zerviah Morrill Aug. 9, 1798 (Danville).

Nathaniel Bachelder (1423), son of Jethro (142).

Pierce has him and his family in twice, as No. 134 on page 148 and as No. 319 on page 176.

Known as Nathaniel Junr. to distinguish him from Nathaniel (172). Always lived at Loudon. Was a farmer, and from 1794, at least, was an innholder.

For possible Revolutionary service, see under Nathaniel (172) ante.

Nathaniel was living Apr. 18, 1798, when he conveyed lands, but died before May 12, 1798, when his widow Anna Bachelder was appointed administratrix. He was "land poor," owning lands in Loudon, Gilmanton and Meredith, mostly mortgaged, so that his unsecured creditors got practically nothing. The probate papers mention maintenance of a child under seven, and "the Children of the first wife of the Decd."

He married first Dorothy Page of Deerfield Sep. 16, 1781 (Deerfield), and second Anna Hook Feb. 9, 1794 (Chichester). Anna married Lieut. Joseph Baker of Loudon Jan. 17, 1799 (Loudon). Pierce says she was born Jan. 28, 1771, and died March, 1820.

Farmer who always lived in Loudon. He was one of the Loudon men who married immediately after the battle of Lexington. Loudon records have entries: - "paid Libe Bachelder three shillings expenses at Concord fight." "Paid Libbe Bachelder for going to Concord." Paid Libey Bachelder for part of a man sent to Benniton" (Bennington).

Libbe married first Love \_\_\_\_\_ (Pierce says Blaisdell). She died Feb. 10, 1824, in 67 yr. (gravestone, "Lovvy wife of Libby Bachelder," Loudon Centre). He married second Susannah Lougee of Loudon June 1, 1824 (Canterbury). She was born about 1761-2, and was living 1850.

Libbe died Aug. 27, 1839, ae 88 (N.H. Patriot Sep. 2, '39). He left a will dated Apr. 7, 1831, which mentions his wife Susannah and the nine children named below, except Peter.

(142,521) wrote that Joshua, Caleb and Nathaniel Ingalls, of Canterbury or thereabouts, were her brothers. Abiah married second Dudley Sanborn of Chichester, who died 1819. Pierce says she also had husbands \_\_\_\_\_ Green and \_\_\_\_\_ Currier, and died at Deerfield Parade in 1851, ae 82. Nathaniel Green of Deerfield, who died 1822, left a widow Abiah.

William died Feb. 15, 1805, in 45<sup>th</sup> yr. (gr.st. Loudon Village). He had deeded his property to Jesse Ingalls of Canterbury, Dec. 31, 1804, under an agreement not recorded, but which apparently required Jesse to convey it to William's sons James and John.

Capt. Abraham Batchelder (1427), son of Jethro (142).

Always lived in Loudon. To distinguish him from No. 141 and No. 1411, he was know as Abraham 3d up to 1804, and from 1809 on he is Abraham Jr.

He was a farmer, a leading citizen in various activities. Taught one of the schools in 1803; selectman 1809, and was noted in the community as a peacemaker in neighborly differences. Was an officer in the militia, Ensign 1793, Lieutenant 1794-1800, and a Captain 1801, by which title he was thereafter known.

Abraham built the house in Loudon which was standing in 1909, and cared for his parents there in their later years.

He married Betsey Smith. I find no record of the marriage, but her name was given thus in a letter of her grandson Joseph P. Batchelder (142,763) in 1882. She was born June 11, 1758, and died Dec. 15, 1844. Abraham died Mar. 20, 1834. Both are buried in Loudon Village cemetery. His will, dated Dec. 12, 1824, proved Sep. \_\_\_\_, 1834, names wife Betsey, the children as below (except Nathaniel), and Joseph Warren Batchelder and Sarah Batchelder, children of his son Smith.

Dr. Nathan Bachellor (1511), son of Nathaniel (151).

Physician. Possibly studied with his uncle, the elder Dr. Amos Gale. Began practise (sic) in Unity, N.H., whither he went in November, 1780. Removed to Epping, N.H., Feb. 1, 1786, and remained there the rest of his life. Had some outside interests, a suit in 1804 for goods sold, in which he is called "trader," suggest running a store, but only this one item found. He was representative in 1810, and dealt somewhat in real estate; also in 1833 sold 9/12 of the Rockingham Cotton Manufactory of Exeter, which then was probably not much of a financial success.

Dr. Nathan married Molly Perkins Jul. 28, 1788, (Epping), dau. Abraham & Mehitable (\_\_\_\_\_) of Epping. She was b. Jan. 10, 1766, and d. Feb. 1, 1835. Dr. Nathan d. in Epping Jan. 19, 1838. He left a will dated Nov. 6, 1833, which named wife Molly, children of late son Nathan Jr., and son Nathaniel.

He and five others, as Nathaniel Bachelor & Co., owned in 1809 the Union Cotton Factory Co. in Union. "Bachelor's Mills" on St. George's River are variously mentioned.

Nathaniel married Ruth Morrill of East Kingston Oct. 25, 1789 (South Hampton town & church). She was born Sep. 27, 1768, and died \_\_\_\_\_ 1848, dau. Benjamin & Abigail (\_\_\_\_\_) of Salisbury, Mass., and East Kingston. Nathaniel died \_\_\_\_\_ 1846 (before June 30). Pierce says he d. May 1, 1844. There is no probate record of his estate, but Ruth left a will, June 30, 1846, - May 10, 1848, which mentions son Cyrus G., daus. Betsey Bachelder, Susannah Bachelder, Polly G. Alden, Louisa Mero, and

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Selina Andrews and Arewesta Alden, chn. of deceased dau. Sally.

Settled in Montville, Me., in December, 1836. Was of Montville in 1850 and 1889. On Feb. 15, 1887, he wrote that he was the only child of Nathaniel (1513) then living. He d. Dec. 20, 1889. Married Betsey White Ayer Oct. , 1837, in Montville, dau. Perley & Mary (White). They had no children, but informally adopted Abbie M. ("Maggie") Greenleaf. She m. Stephen M. Bagley of Montville

Major Amos Moody Bachelor (1515), son of Nathaniel (151).

Farmer. Lived at East Kingston. Selectman (1823?). Was First Major of the 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Militia in 1808, and thereafter known as "Major." Married his step-sister Sally Stocker Sep. 11, 1798 (Kingston town & church), dau. William and Judith (Osgood), born Sep. 2, 1772, in Salisbury, Mass., and died in East Kingston Mar. 25, 1855, ae. 82.6. He died in East Kingston Dec. 25, 1860.

Nathan Batchelder 3rd (1521), son of Nathan (152).

To be distinguished from the other Nathans of Loudon, - Nos. 171, 152, 14111, and 17112. Farmer. He wrote his signature "Nathan Batchelder 3rd." Taxed at Loudon 1793, 1795, 1800, 1801, 1804 and 1806-15. Probably always lived there except for short periods before marriage.

Nathan Batchelder and Miriam Jones, both of South Hampton, were married Aug. 2, 1801 (So. Hampton and Kensington). Her name is more commonly on record as Maria, particularly in deeds as administratrix of her husband's estate, but one deed from Andrew Batchelder

(1424) in 1816, is to "Meriam Batchelder" as administratrix, and "Wd. Miriam Batchelder" received poor relief in 1819. She is Maria in the probate papers and her gravestone reads "Maria wife of Nathan Batchelder Jr." died Feb. 15, 1829, ae. 48. Nathan's stone reads "Nathan Batchelder Jr." died June 3, 1815, ae 43.

Nathan died intestate, and his widow Maria was appointed to administer the estate of Nathan Junr Jan. 17, 1816. The later papers in the estate call him Nathan 3<sup>d</sup>. I suspect this confusion in the gravestone and administration appointment, in the use of "Junr," are due to the death of Nathan Junr. (152), father of Nathan 3<sup>d</sup>, having occurred also in 1815, thus leading to confusion in the proper form of designation. The estate was insolvent, and Maria's deeds in selling the real estate describe Nathan as "third," or "3<sup>d</sup>."

The births of Nathan's children are not on record. The 1810 census of Loudon gives him a family of five males, and no females, under 10. The administration account in his estate charges for the support of children, Andrew, Harris and Daniel, for one year after Nathan's death. That should mean they were under seven years of age at their father's death. Others named by Abraham Byron Batchelder (152,114) in 1914, besides Andrew, Harris and Hiram, were Samuel, Daniel and Mary. With the stones of Nathan and Maria, at Loudon Centre are also stones of Mary C. Batchelder, died Feb. 9, 1840, ae 32, and of Amos Batchelder, died May 10, 1830, ae 28. I assume these are children of Nathan & Maria. Maria had a son Hiram, born as below.

David Batchelder (1522), son of Nathan (152).

Farmer. Wrote his name Bachellor in 1814, but later Batchelder. His family Bible gives his name as David G. (which initial he never used), and his date of birth, as Sep. 20, 1775.

David lived in Loudon, where he is called David Jr., to distinguish him from No. 14,212, until 1804, when he moved to Barnstead. Between 1829 and 1833 he moved to Stratham, N.H., where he died Jan. 31, 1843, ae. 67.

He married Mehitable Lang of Loudon Dec. 22, 1803, (Loudon), dau. of Stephen & Abigail (Weare).
