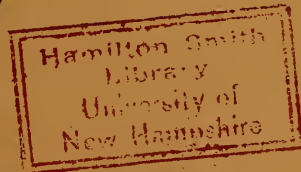



# Town Clerk's Records

---

REPORT OF THE TOWN MEETING HELD MARCH  
13, 1917.

---

In accordance with a notice, duly signed and legally posted, the legal voters of the Town of Hampton assembled at the place therein mentioned and were called to order by the moderator of the Town at thirty-five minutes past ten o'clock in the forenoon of said day. The presiding officer read the warrant after which prayer was offered by the Rev. Mr. Ross.

Chose—Herbert L. Tobey, Town Clerk, for the ensuing year, who was sworn

Voted—That the Selectmen be elected one at a time.

Chose—Joseph B. Brown, Elroy G. Shaw and Howell M. Lamprey as Selectmen for the ensuing year, who were sworn.

Chose—Herbert Perkins, Treasurer, for the ensuing year.

Chose—Ernest G. Cole, Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year.

Voted—That the Clerk cast one ballot for Howard G. Lane for Trustee of Trust Funds and Howard G. Lane was declared elected as said Trustee.

Voted—That we go back to the old system of repair and maintenance of highways under the Highway Law of 1899.

Voted—That the appointment of Road Surveyors be left to the Selectmen.

Voted—That the Clerk cast one ballot for Howard G.

Church, Simeon A. Shaw and Charles F. Adams for Auditors for the ensuing year, and

(Chose)—Albert K. Church, Simeon A. Shaw and Charles F. Adams were declared elected as Auditors for the ensuing year, and were sworn.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000) for salaries of Town Officers.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150) for expense of Municipal Court.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400) for care of and supplies for the Town Hall and Library, and that accounts of expenditures for Town Hall and Library be kept separately.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1200) for Police Department.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3500) for Fire Department.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) for the extermination of Brown Tail Moths and that the money be expended under the direction of one competent man to be designated by the Board of Selectmen.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800) for cleaning up back yards and collecting garbage at Hampton Beach.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate a total of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000) for Highway purposes, this sum to include the amount raised by Highway Tax.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$3300) for Street Lighting.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$550) for Library.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Sev-



enty-five Dollars (\$75) for Memorial Day.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) for Cemetery.

Voted—That the Selectmen be instructed to fix the sewer at the Beach in accordance with plans submitted by the Engineer consulted by the Selectmen.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Four Hundred Eighty-five and 36-100 Dollars (\$2485.36) to pay interest on the amount the Selectmen have to borrow for use of the Town.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1500) for Sidewalk Construction.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000) for Breakwater at Hampton Beach.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) to be expended by the Selectmen in improving the sanitary condition of the Town Hall and providing emergency exits.

Voted—That we raise or appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000) for buildings to be used for Police Station and Fire Department.

Voted—That the power requested by the Selectmen in Article 5 be granted.

Voted—That we appropriate from the amount already appropriated for Highways Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for use on Island Path Road

Voted—That the Selectmen be instructed to remove all fences obstructing the old pathway on the south side of Great Boars Head and a walk be constructed for foot passengers.

Voted—That Island Path Road be opened up to its full width.

Voted—That Article 9 be passed over.

Voted—That the Selectmen be instructed to take the necessary steps to secure proper deeds or titles on all

property sold for taxes or sewer assessments.

Voted—That a discount of 3 per cent. be allowed on all taxes paid before Aug. 1st.

Howell M. Lamprey offered the following:—

Resolved—That, The citizens of Hampton, in Town Meeting assembled, affirm their loyal adherence to the principles of vigorous freedom fundamental to the existence of the United States.

They declare their approval of the course of the President of the United States in all his efforts to protect the lives and property of their fellow citizens against piratical attacks upon the sea.

They urge upon him and upon all representatives of the people the speedy prosecution of every measure calculated to strengthen the entire nation to guard its own rights and the rights of humanity against unwarranted aggression.

And in the carrying out of such measures for the common defence they pledge to the Chief Executive and to Congress their unqualified support.

It was moved and seconded and unanimously

Voted—That the foregoing Resolution be adopted and accepted.

It was also

Voted—That a copy of the foregoing Resolution and action thereon be forwarded to the Governor of the State.

Voted—That all guide boards throughout the Town be painted and put in repair.

Adjourned

# Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

---

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hampton, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hampton, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a delegate to the convention to revise the constitution to be held in June.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose three Selectmen for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To choose Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Trustee of Trust Funds, Auditors, Library Trustees and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To raise or appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for salaries of Town Officers, Municipal Court, Election Officers, Supplies for Town Hall, Police Department, Fire Department, Moth Extermination, Health Department, Highways, Street Lighting, Library, Town Poor, Memorial Day, Cemetery, Sewer Department, Interest, Sidewalk Construction, Breakwater, State Tax, County Tax and all other necessary charges arising within the town

Article 6. To see if the Town will give the Selectmen power to raise money in anticipation of taxes or to renew or refund the Town Notes.

Article 7. To hear the report of agents or committees heretofore chosen.

Article 8. To pass any vote or votes that may be legal before said meeting.

The accessions to the library for the year ending Jan. 31, 1918, have been 163 volumes by purchase, and ten volumes by gift. Also twelve volumes have been replaced. Total number of volumes on catalogue, 5364. The circulation among residents has been 8,428 volumes; among non-residents 379, making a total of 8807 volumes. Number of volumes issued the previous year, 9,303.

Perhaps the severe winter had something to do with the decreased circulation. Also the many stormy evenings and bad walking caused a noticeable decrease in the attendance at the reading room.

Owing to the scarcity of fuel, the committee deemed it advisable to close the reading room until April 1st., on Monday and Thursday evenings; also on Tuesdays and Friday evenings when stormy.
